James Gardner Allergy Nurse Consultant at the Food Allergy Immunotherapy Centre Great Ormond Street Hospital

James qualified at Great Ormond Street Hospital in London as a Paediatric Nurse and, after working in general paediatrics/haematology, joined the allergy team at St Mary's Hospital, London then for many years was the lead allergy nurse at the Royal Free Hospital & Royal National Throat, Nose and Ear Hospital, both in London.

Until recently was Children's and Young Persons Allergy Nurse Consultant at the Great North Children's Hospital in Newcastle.

He is Associate Clinical Lecturer in Newcastle University where he is lead of the Allergy E-module masters programme.

James previously completed his MSc in Allergy from the University of Southampton and focused on the use of component resolved diagnostics in peanut allergy. He is the current Secretary of the Allied Health working group in the European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology and Vice Chair of BSACI Nurses Group.

He has been involved in several European task force groups through the academy including expert panel for the anaphylaxis guideline. Other work includes competencies for allied health working in allergy, MHealth and social media.
