KEY FINDINGS

- 45% died before seeking or receiving medical attention
- 47% had a previous hospital admission
- 10% died with 28 days of discharge from hospital
- 58% had mild/moderate asthma
- 23% had asthma action plans
- 43% no review in primary care in year before death
- 50% triggers were documented




